We were received by the State Coordinator in his office, who introduced himself to us and two key members of his staff. Thereafter the Director of Information and Media, Mrs. Ruth Adole, introduced us and members of our team to the state coordinator.

After introductions, the General Secretary made a presentation using slides. He summarized the vision, mission and activities of TFI, as well as why we came and made appeal for partnership in the following areas:

Responding, the State Coordinator of National Human Rights Commission, Mr. Tyover Joshua Aondotindi welcomed us again and commended our advocacy the rights of teenagers. He intimated our team on the activities of the Commission especially in the area of rights protection and prosecution of rights abuse, as well as some intervention projects especially among the Hausa community in Makurdi suburbs.
